

# South Africa's War On Elephants

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"Scientists argue that culling is a crude technique for solving problems that grew from poor wildlife management such as confining elephants to reserves with permanent watering points which disrupts their natural movements as their population cannot spread out.

Culling is never the answer. Relocation, expanding park spaces, contraceptives and creating corridors between parks to allow more even population distribution are more efficient and humane than just to pick up a gun and resort to a violent and quick fix.

South Africa, with over 3 million hectares of National Parks, claims it does not have enough room for 18,000 elephants (although Kenya with less National Park land has nearly 70% more elephants).

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
